Introduction

As a training and technical assistance provider of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) National Comprehensive Cancer Control Program, the American Cancer Society is pleased to share this social media communications toolkit.

The annual **National Lung Cancer Screening Day**, to be held this year on November 11, 2023, is sponsored by the American Cancer Society National Lung Cancer Roundtable, the American College of Radiology, and the Radiology Health Equity Coalition. As part of a key initiative of Lung Cancer Awareness Month, and in acknowledgment of National LCS Day falling on the Veterans Day holiday, the ACS NLCRT, ACR, and RHEC have partnered with the Veterans Administration on this campaign in order to **salute our Veterans by increasing outreach and awareness to our veteran population**, in turn saving more lives.

The campaign asks that screening facilities open their doors on the second Saturday in November for low-dose CT (LDCT) lung screening. It also seeks to raise overall awareness of the importance of lung cancer screening in the United States.

Comprehensive Cancer Control coalitions play a vital role in improving public awareness about lung cancer screening, reducing disparities through the education of providers, and promoting important public health events such as **National Lung Cancer Screening Day**. This communications toolkit was created especially for Comprehensive Cancer Control (CCC) coalitions, to help them promote and disseminate accurate information and unified messaging among their partner organizations. The unique overlap in 2023 of National Lung Cancer Screening Day with Veterans Day offers an unprecedented opportunity for partnership. Reach out to your **state/tribe/territorial Veterans Affairs**' coalition partners to discuss opportunities to promote appropriate lung cancer screening to our nation's veterans in 2023.

Lung cancer continues to have the highest mortality rate of cancers worldwide, with populations from lower socioeconomic backgrounds having the highest incidence rates¹. Workers earning less than \$15/hour commonly have less access to paid leave or are less eligible for FMLA protections and more commonly face adverse financial and job consequences from taking leave².

The **National Lung Cancer Screening Day** campaign has two main goals. The first goal is to

campaign has two main goals. The first goal is to help raise awareness of early cancer detection through regular lung cancer screening. And the second goal is to reduce access disparities by encouraging screening providers to open their clinics on Saturdays for patients who cannot leave work during weekdays.





The American Cancer Society National Lung Cancer Roundtable (ACS NLCRT), American College of Radiology® (ACR), and Radiology Health Equity Coalition (RHEC) have partnered once again for the second annual National Lung Cancer Screening Day ("National LCS Day") on Saturday, November 11, 2023. As a key initiative of Lung Cancer Awareness Month, and in partnership with the ACS NLCRT, ACR, RHEC, and Veteran's Health Administration, we are promoting this lifesaving event to help more individuals get screened and raise awareness about lung cancer screening. The President's Cancer Panel recommends lung cancer screening as the single most effective strategy for reducing mortality from the disease and helping to close the gap to improve health equity and access to care. To achieve this goal, the President's Cancer Panel has charged individuals, health systems, and communities with communicating and promoting lung cancer screening.

Enhancing Accessibility to Lung Cancer Screening

Ten years have passed since the United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) first recommended low-dose CT (LDCT) for lung cancer screening, yet lung cancer screening rates remain low with fewer than 1 in 10 eligible individuals undergoing annual LDCT screening. This is a striking contrast to more established screening tests for other cancers, including screening mammography (about 67%), colorectal cancer screening (about 69%), and cervical cancer screening (around 74%)³.

Access to and utilization of lung cancer screening has been particularly challenging for rural and racial/ethnic minority groups, who face the following barriers:

- Likely to live more than 30 minutes away from a designated screening center
- May be underinsured
- May have lower health literacy levels
- · May have inadequate access to care

Low utilization rates for lung cancer screening present an opportunity for patient and caregiver advocates, community health organizations, medical professionals, cancer centers, health systems, payers, and industry partners to work together to promote health equity, reduce health care disparities, and enhance accessibility to lifesaving and effective lung cancer screening.




National Lung Cancer Screening Day: Messaging Toolkit

The Great American Smokeout®

The American Cancer Society Great American Smokeout® event takes place on November 16, 2023, the third Thursday of November, encouraging people who smoke to use this date to make a plan to quit or to plan in advance to stop smoking that day. Empowered to Quit

American Cancer Society researchers developed **Empowered to Quit**, an email-based program to help people quit smoking. The person must complete a short form in the welcome email to receive customized emails, which will help personalize the email journey and improve the program for participants.
