The <u>ACS Cancer Statistics Center</u> is an extension of the <u>ACS Cancer Facts & Figures</u> and Cancer Statistics reports. This ACS resource provides detailed statistics on topics such as: the estimated numbers of new cancer cases and

deaths in the current year **by site and state**; cancer incidence, mortality, and survival rates and trends; and state-level risk factor and screening prevalence. The website aims to serve the needs of cancer control advocates, researchers and academics, journalists, government and private public health agencies, and policy makers, as well as patients, survivors, and the general public, in order to promote cancer prevention and control.
