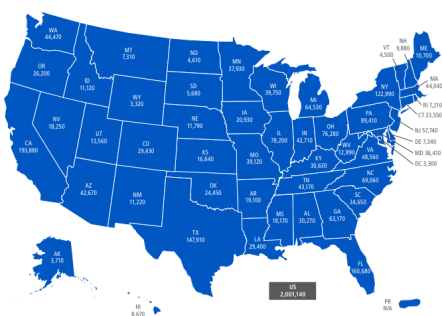

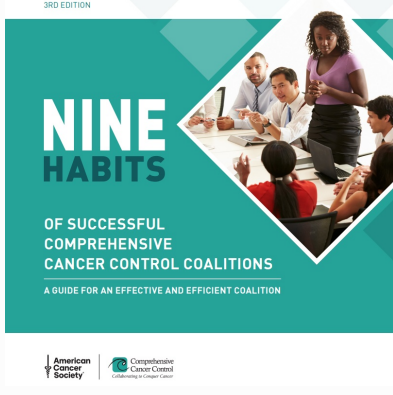

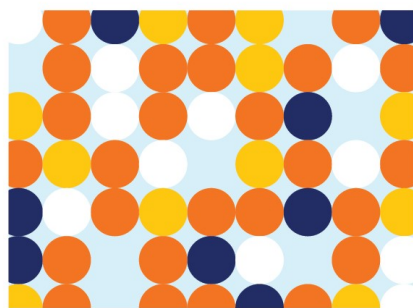
- Estimated numbers of new cancer cases and deaths in 2024 by cancer site and US state

The planning tool consists of three phases:

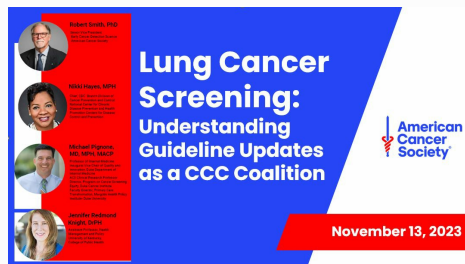
1. Assess the Landscape
