This helpful food security toolkit for CCC coalitions contains resources and recommendations that are aligned with the Whitehouse National Strategy for improving food access and affordability and integrating nutrition into disease management. The prevalence of low food security among people with cancer and their caregivers is much higher than the prevalence in the general population.

Cancer in People who identify as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, or Gender-nonconforming

In a first-of-its-kind study, the American Cancer Society on May 31 released <u>"Cancer in People who Identify as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or Gender-nonconforming (LGBTQ+)".</u> The article provides the latest statistics on the prevalence of cancer screening and modifiable risk factors in LGBTQ+ populations, as well as a review of literature on cancer occurrence and obstacles to cancer prevention and treatment.

These important findings are published in the journal Cancer, alongside its consumer-friendly companion, <u>Cancer Facts & Figures 2024 Special Section:</u>
